

Burundi container with solar panels

Bolloré Logistics Portugal has transported more than 25,000 solar panels for the construction of a 7.5 megawatts (MW) renewable energy power plant in Burundi. The operation took place in several stages over a period of four months.

We implemented an innovative manual unloading device for compact photovoltaic plants in containers, from a standard truck (without the need for an articulated arm) to allow unloading in isolated and hard-to-reach places.

Burundi is an extremely suitable location for a battery-powered solar installation. The 16kWp PV installation, along with a 15kVa/28kWh battery, will be able to provide the school with electricity virtually all year round.

Container homes in Burundi are often designed with simple, functional layouts, focusing on practicality rather than luxury. Due to the country's warm and tropical climate, many container homes incorporate features like wide verandas and large windows to promote airflow and natural cooling.

Solar panel arrays are typically shipped as FCL (Full Container Load) or OOG (Out of Gauge) cargo, depending on size and weight. They are packaged in wooden crates or pallets, with each panel individually wrapped and secured. Packaging must withstand Ocean freight rigors. Built through a multinational effort, the pioneering 7.5 MW solar PV plant near the village of Mubuga has been in operation since May 2021 and now provides over 10% of Burundi's electricity, supplying clean power



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to tens of thousands of homes and businesses.

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
