What are the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands consist of the main atoll of Cocos, and the isolated North Keeling (Pulu Keeling) which is Australia's smallest Commonwealth National Park.

It is available in paper and electronic formats. The Cocos (Keeling) Islands receives a range of digital channels from Western Australia via satellite and is broadcast from the Airport Building on the West Island on the following VHF frequencies: ABC6, SBS7, WAW8, WOW10 and WDW11

How many islands are in the Cocos Islands?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands comprise a southern horseshoe-shaped atoll (South Keeling Islands, hereafter referred to as Cocos) with more than 20 sandy reef islands around a shallow lagoon (Figure 1), and a northern reef island with a small remnant lagoonlet, North Keeling.

What is the capital of Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

The capital of the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands is West Island while the largest settlement is the village of Bantam, on Home Island. Governance of the islands is based on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands Act 1955 and depends heavily on the laws of Australia.

Where are the Cocos Islands?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands are an Australian Territory in the eastern Indian Ocean, and comprise an atoll that has had a particularly significant place in the development of coral reef studies.

There are 27 coral islands in the group. Captain William KEELING discovered the islands in 1609, but they remained uninhabited until the 19th century. From the 1820s to 1978, members of the CLUNIES-ROSS family controlled the islands and the copra produced from local coconuts.
