Are there Lions in Eritrea?

It is amazing how it was less than a hundred years ago that Eritrea was home thousands of species. Lions and greater kudus and Torah arte-beasts are still found in the mountains of Gash-Barka Region. Rarely could they be seen even in other places. Besides,Eritrea's large population of elephants roams in this region.

How is Eritrea addressing wildlife conservation?

The government of Eritrea has taken several important steps to address wildlife conservation. The country was one of the first in the world to ban the production,sale,and distribution of plastic bags. It has outlawed the hunting and trapping of wild animals and banned the cutting of live trees.

What animals live in Eritrea?

In the past,Eritrea was home to a large range of animals,including buffaloes,cheetahs,elephants,giraffes,hippos,Nubian ibexes,leopards,lions and waterbucks. But then due to different things: such as deforestation,wars,poor farming methods their numbers have drastically declined.

Are there endangered animals in Eritrea?

Conservation efforts are in place to protect endangered animal species and their habitats in Eritrea. Unfortunately,Eritrea is also home to several endangered animal species. Two endangered gazelle species,the Dorcas gazelle and Soemmering gazelle,can be found in Eritrea.

What is the national animal of Eritrea?

The national animal of Eritrea is the dromedary. Sometimes called the Arabian camel,the dromedary actually only has one hump on its back. It is a species of even-toed ungulate and the tallest species of camel. Unlike other camels,the dromedary has a long,curved neck as well as a narrow chest.

Where to see wildlife in Eritrea?

There are many places to see wildlife in Eritrea. Visitors can spot lions and greater kudus in the mountain regions. In the Denkalia region, elephants and gazelles roam. In the Nakfa and Gash-Setit wildlife parks, you'll see bushbucks, duikers, greater kudus, klipspringers, leopards, oryxes, and crocodiles.

Are There Lions in Eritrea? Lions are not native to Eritrea, but people have occasionally seen them in the mountain ranges. Eritrea's native big cats include the Sudan cheetah (*Acinonyx jubatus soemmeringii*), African leopard (*Panthera pardus pardus*), caracal (*Caracal caracal*) and African wild cat (*Felis lybica*).

Reports of Lion come sporadically from Sandachina in south western Gash Barka, including reports by local villagers of males roaring, but no confirmed sightings have been made for 20 years. Leopard are widespread, but local and largely nocturnal.
