Electricidade e Aguas da Guine-Bissau (EAGB) is the national electricity and water company of Guinea Bissau. It is owned by the government and represents the country in the West African Power Pool. Installed electric capacity in 2001 was 1,100 kW; 2007 production was estimated to 65 million kWh, of which 100% came from fossil fuels.

The World Bank is supporting the development of Guinea-Bissau's first solar power plants, aiming to decarbonise electricity production and boost electrification. Under the Solar Energy and Access to Electricity Development Project, the World Bank will assist Guinea-Bissau until 2030 and has already approved a USD \$30 million grant.

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The coast of Guinea-Bissau, with its deeply indented coastline, experiences high tidal range values making this a commercially viable energy resource. The highest mean annual tidal amplitude of 3.4 m was recorded at Porto
