

What are Guyana's Nationally Determined Contributions?

In the Nationally Determined Contributions, Guyana has committed to develop a mix of wind, solar, biomass and hydro-power to supply both demand of the national grid and the energy requirements for towns and villages in Guyana's hinterland. Guyana has set an ambitious target of achieving close to 100% renewable energy in the power sector by 2025.

Where does Guyana's Energy come from?

This page is part of Global Energy Monitor's Latin America Energy Portal. More than 90% of Guyana's total energy supply comes from fossil fuels, with the remainder derived from renewables such as wood and sugar cane residue.

What type of electricity is used in Guyana?

The electricity sector in Guyana is dominated by Guyana Power and Light (GPL), the state-owned vertically integrated utility. Although most of Guyana's electricity comes from thermoelectric diesel-engine driven generators (226 MW of installed capacity), the country has a large potential for hydroelectric and bagasse-fueled power generation.

What does the Guyana energy agency (GEA) do?

GEA (Guyana Energy Agency) is responsible for developing Guyana's national energy policy and securing its implementation. As of 2021, the GEA is tasked with growing the labor participation of locals by providing training programs to meet the employment demands expected to peak in 2027.

Who owns the electricity industry in Guyana?

The electricity industry is operated by the state-owned electricity company, Guyana Light and Power Inc. (GPL), with an installed operating capacity of 337 MW in 2020.

What is the future of energy in Guyana?

The development of alternative renewable energies, such as solar, wind, hydropower, and biomass technologies, remains a key priority for the future growth of the energy sector in Guyana. Government of Guyana has committed to reducing the cost of electricity by at least 50% over the next five years (Budget 2022).

Guyana is currently implementing three small hydropower projects: a 150kW in Kato, the rehabilitation of Moco-Moco hydropower site, which would increase the capacity up to 0.7MW and a new 1.5MW hydropower plant in Kumu.
