

What energy sources are available in Mozambique?

Mozambique has abundant energy sources available for exploitation. As of 2021, the country was ranked first in energy potential of all the countries in the Southern African Power Pool (SAPP), with an estimated energy capacity of 187,000 MW. Available energy sources include coal, hydroelectricity, natural gas, solar energy and wind power.

How much solar energy does Mozambique have?

Mozambique has a potential solar energy yield estimated between 1,785 and 2,206 kWh/m²/year, resulting in a solar energy potential of 23,000 GWh/year. In August 2019, the first grid-ready solar power station, the 40 megawatts Mocuba Solar Power Station, in Mocuba District, Zambezia Province, achieved commercial commissioning.

How can Mozambique contribute to a green energy transition?

Studies have indicated that this could a 60% reduction in the country's aluminium exports and a 2.5% decrease in the country's GDP. On the other hand, Mozambique also has unrivalled natural energy resources that could significantly contribute to a green energy transition, not only domestically but also in the Southern African region.

What is PV power potential in Mozambique?

The PV power potential map developed by the World Bank shows the potential for PV power projects in Mozambique on a scale of a yearly total specific PV power output of 1,534 to 1,753 kWh/kWp. The zones marked in the darkest shade show the highest potential.

Should Mozambique be included in the energy transition debates at COP27?

When unattended, however, it is estimated that the country's energy sector emissions could increase fivefold from 17 MtCO₂e/year in 2020 to almost 85 MtCO₂e by 2050. And there are more reasons why ignoring countries like Mozambique in the energy transition debates at COP27 might be ill-advised.

How much power does Mozambique have?

As of 2019, Mozambique had 2,185 MW of installed hydroelectric generation capacity, accounting for 92 percent of total national installed capacity of 2,375 MW. The 2,075 megawatts Cahora Bassa Hydroelectric Power Station (CBHPS) across the Zambezi River, is the largest power station in Mozambique.

Regardless of the power system expansion strategy selected by Mozambique, there is a critical need to strengthen Mozambique's power transmission capabilities if the country is to achieve its electricity generation objectives.

Large scale renewable projects are becoming a point of interest for investment in Mozambique, specifically solar and hydro. Mozambique's main body to promote renewable energy access, FUNAE, expects that the capacity of on-grid renewable energy from independent power producers (IPP) will increase to 575 MW by 2030.

Mozambique has the largest power generation potential of all Southern African countries, with the capacity to generate 187 GW of power from coal, hydro, gas, solar, wind, and other renewable sources, according to

Deloitte's Africa Energy Outlook Report 2024.

Currently, 82% of Mozambique's power generation capacity comes from hydro sources. But the country has a vast diversity of energy resources, of which approximately 88% are renewable, representing an aggregate potential of more than 23,026 GW - sufficient capacity to both meet domestic demand and export to neighboring countries.

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For a country like Mozambique, renewable energy (RE) could help sustainably reduce the energy gaps between the urban and rural areas (SDG 7), while responding to the climate change challenge (SDG 13).

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
