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Among its thematic areas of focus are universal energy access, energy efficiency, electric mobility, distributed generation, grid modernisation and the hydrocarbons sector. The Council is comprised of a number of stakeholders from the public and private sectors and academia.

Panama is the top energy consumer in Central America and imports more than 80% of its energy. In order to meet consumer demand, Panama is part of the SIEPAC (Sistema de Interconexi3n El3ctrica de los Pa3ses de Am3rica Central), the electrical transmission grid connecting Central American countries.

Panama is committed to unlocking both a blue and green economy through sustainable use of ocean resources, increased use of clean energy, ecological programs to preserve wildlife habitat and environmental regulations to reduce plastic waste and marine pollution while fostering eco-tourism and sustainable fishing.

Panama's National Energy Plan 2015-2050 outlines long-term strategy for the country's energy sector development, including renewables. The Plan established that 15% of Panama's generation capacity will come from renewables by 2030 and 50% by 2050.

Energy infrastructure development in Panama, as in the rest of Latin America, was conceived under assumptions of climate stability, anticipating minimal or even no changes in climate behaviour over the long term. However, in the past decade, Panama's climate patterns have changed significantly (Ministerio de Ambiente Panama, 2021).

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
