

# Serbia tie grid solar system

Why does Serbia need a solar grid?

By creating a network of self-balancing solar plants, Serbia strengthens its energy security, attracts green investments, and aligns with global environmental standards. An interconnected grid also allows Serbia to better distribute energy, meeting future demands while maintaining grid stability.

What does a solar project mean for Serbia?

For Serbia, this project means more than just meeting renewable energy goals. It promises energy independence, economic stability, and a sustainable energy supply. Where will solar power be installed in Serbia?

The Ministry of Mining and Energy and EPS (Elektroprivreda Srbije) partnered with Hyundai Engineering and UGT Renewables to drive this project. Serbia will soon see six large solar plants strategically positioned across the country. Key locations include Negotin, Zajecar, and Bosnjace.

Does Serbia have a green energy strategy?

This groundbreaking project, led by the Hyundai Engineering and UGT Renewables consortium, marks a significant shift in Serbia's energy strategy. Serbia aims to boost green energy, reduce fossil fuel reliance, and stabilize its energy grid through this ambitious initiative.

Could Serbia's existing production capacity halt solar power plants and wind farms?

The adequacy analysis assessed that Serbia's existing production capacities could withhold solar power plants and wind farms with a combined 5,800 MW. This is close to an earlier assessment.

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After months of ironing out the details, Serbia has started applying new legislation that regulates the procedure for connection to the national power grid. Specifically, the transmission system operator, Elektromreza Srbije (EMS), has acted on renewable energy investors' requests to sign agreements on the preparation of grid connection ...

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Dunja Grujic, Head of the Sector for the Market Support at Elektro distribucija Srbije has revealed that 171 solar power plants with an installed capacity of 60 MW are currently connected to the distribution system of Serbia. If you add 70 MW of 3,600 prosumers, a total of 130 MW of solar is connected to the distribution system.

Serbia will sign a contract with US firm UGT Renewables in the coming days for the construction of solar parks with a total installed capacity exceeding 1 GW, president Aleksandar Vucic said.

Serbia's new rules for connecting solar parks and wind farms to the transmission system, operated by Elektromreza Srbije, are a test for both the state-owned company and investors, according to participants at Belgrade Energy Forum.

Last year we secured land for 490MW of solar developments in Serbia, in line with new legislations for the country's renewable energy development. For the most recent TSO deadline, in December 2023, we submitted four PV grid applications with accompanied BESS.

The Development Plan for the Transmission System of the Republic of Serbia, spanning 2023 to 2032, has set a maximum capacity threshold for renewable energy sources at 5800 MW, divided into 4800 MW from wind farms and 1000 MW from solar facilities.

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Serbia's transmission system operator, Elektromreza Srbije, has decided to delay the connection to the grid of solar power plants and wind farms that don't have a contract on developing a grid connection study. However, such projects could access the network if the investors secure balancing capacity.

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
