Why is Mali building a new solar power plant?

As Mali grapples with an ongoing electricity crisis that hampers economic growth, transitional President Assimi Goïta laid the foundation stone for a new 200 MW photovoltaic solar power plant. The Russian company NovaWind, a subsidiary of Rosatom, is constructing the plant, marking a significant step in the country's energy sector.

The Russian company NovaWind, a subsidiary of Rosatom, is constructing the plant, marking a significant step in the country's energy sector. In recent weeks, Mali's transitional government has intensified efforts to implement this solution nationwide.

What is a Russian nuclear project in Mali?

The project, worth over USD 200 million (EUR 184m), is a partnership between Mali and Russia. It will be built by Russian company Novawind, a division of Rosatom, the Russian nuclear corporation. The plant is located in Sanankoroba in the Koulikoro region of southern Mali and will improve electricity supply in the West African state.

Where is the largest solar power plant in Sub-Saharan Africa?

On May 24, 2024, President Goïta visited Sanankoroba in the Kati Cercle to initiate the construction of the largest solar power plant in sub-Saharan Africa, covering 314 hectares. About thirty kilometers from the capital, Bamako, this project is part of a government partnership with NovaWind.
